## OCAF CHAIR JOHN D McKELLAR WINS GOVERNOR GENERAL'S AWARD

Congratulations to OCAF Chair **John D McKellar, C.M.** for being awarded The Ramon John Hnatyshyn Award for Voluntarism in the Performing Arts (RJH). The 2016 **Governor General's Performing Arts Awards** (GGPAA) will honour seven new laureates (including John) at its annual gala, which takes place June 11 2016, at the National Arts Centre. Named for Governor General Hnatyshyn, who created the GGPAA in 1992, the RJH Award recognizes outstanding contribution by an individual or group in voluntary service to the performing arts in Canada.

John is known for the many performing artists and arts organizations he has advised, counseled and supported. In addition to being Chair of the **Ontario Cultural Attractions Fund**, he is former Chair of the **Toronto Arts Council**, Vice Chairman **Ontario Arts Foundation**, Chairman of the **Young Centre for the Performing Arts**, an advisor to the **Randolph Academy for the Performing Arts**, and a board member of **Tarragon Theatre**, **Off-Centre Music Salon** and The **Glenn Gould Foundation**. The Ontario Cultural Attractions Fund (OCAF) was established in 1999. It has three aims: (1) to increase cultural tourism by providing investments to assist Ontario organizations to develop, promote and present one-off or first time events, or a significant expansion of existing activity, which are designed to attract new tourists and visitors to cultural events; (2) increase the earned revenue capability of the applicant organization; and (3) support events that foster economic growth and contribute to job creation. Since 1999, the Government of Ontario has invested \$37.75 million in cultural events through the Fund.
